Promote and Engage with the NHS Test and Trace process	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Contact DfE Helpline 0800 046 8687 (Option 1)</li> <li>• Ensure school has Local PHE Health Protection Team (LHPT) contact information</li> <li>• Ensure parents and staff:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Self-isolate if:                   <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ They develop symptoms; someone in their childcare or support bubble develops symptoms; if they have been in close contact with someone who tests positive for Covid-19; they are required to quarantine having recently visited countries outside the common travel area; they have been advised to isolate by NHS test and trace or PHE</li> </ul> </li> <li>➤ Book a test</li> <li>➤ Provide details of those who have been in close contact</li> </ul> </li> <li>• If test result is negative, and no symptoms are displayed, return to school is possible</li> <li>• If test result is positive, the pupil / staff member must isolate from the day of onset of their symptoms and at least the following 10 full days. 10b. Use of the NHS Covid-19 App	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Staff using NHS Covid-19 App - If a staff member receives a notification during the school day via the app that they have been in close contact with a confirmed case and should therefore self-isolate, they should report this immediately to Covid-19 Coordinator before leaving the school premises, and continue to follow PHE advice</li> <li>• Staff should be advised to pause the contact tracing feature of the app if there are periods of time when they will not be near their phone (for example, where it is in a locker), to avoid the app misidentifying close contacts.</li> </ul>	<p>No further action is needed unless the member of staff goes on to become a confirmed case themselves.</p> <p>When someone switches contact tracing off, the app will give the user the option to set a reminder for 4, 8 or 12 hours, after which they will receive a notification to remind them to switch contact tracing back on.</p> <p><a href="https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/use-of-the-nhs-covid-19-app-in-schools-and-further-education-colleges/use-of-the-nhs-covid-19-app-in-schools-and-further-education-colleges">https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/use-of-the-nhs-covid-19-app-in-schools-and-further-education-colleges</a></p>

Manage confirmed cases of coronavirus amongst the school community - Remote education support	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Whole School / Section of School Closure Maintain a broad and balanced curriculum <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➢ Use of Zoom to deliver lessons following in-school timetable and Schemes of Work</li> <li>➢ Use of VLE to set and feedback on work</li> <li>➢ Ensure that textbooks, exercise books and other resources are taken home before boys leave school</li> <li>➢ Incorporate regular assessments</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<p>School to assess degree of closure according to the numbers of boys / staff isolating</p> <p>Learning Support provision via Zoom and VLE tasks</p> <p>Enrichment and Activities revert back to VLE tasks</p> <p>Blended Learning Guidelines (Rec) and Blended Learning Guidelines (Yrs 1-8) are followed</p>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Maintain Form Teacher contact / pastoral support</li> </ul>	Form Time each day before lessons and Friday lunchtime (Yrs 5-8)

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• If a member of teaching staff is unable to come in owing to isolation <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➢ Lessons delivered via Zoom with cover / supply teacher in the classroom</li> <li>➢ Work set and marked via the VLE where possible</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	Staff to be given laptops
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• If a Teaching / School Assistant is unable to come in owing to isolation cover is needed</li> </ul>	
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• If a member of teaching staff or Teaching / School Assistant unable to come in owing to illness, cover / supply is needed</li> </ul>	
12. Contain any outbreak by following local health protection team advice	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• If there is an outbreak the DfE/LHPT will advise if additional action is required</li> <li>• Pupils / staff who tested positive for Covid-19 can return to school after they have finished their isolation period and their symptoms have gone or if they continue to only have a residual cough or anosmia.</li> </ul>	<p>Possible self-isolation of a group of pupils, mobile testing unit at school, closure of school / part of school</p> <p>An outbreak is defined as 2 or more confirmed cases within 14 days, or an overall rise in sickness absence where Covid-19 is suspected</p>
